# 188th Wing receives 3rd Air Force Outstanding Unit Award

The 188th Wing, and all its supporting groups and squadrons, has distinguished itself for the third time in unit history as a recipient of the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award for their accomplishments spanning Oct. 1, 2011 through Sept. 30, 2013. The 188th has won two AFOUAs in the last five years.

At the time of the award period, the 188th was designated as the 188th Fighter

Wing with a manned aircraft mission, flying the A-10C Thunderbolt II “Warthog.”

During the two-year span, the 188th contributed directly to the fulfillment of strategic national objectives by completing the largest deployment in unit history in support of Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan. More than 350 Airmen and 10 aircraft deployed to support combat operations in the area of responsibility and set unit records in combat sorties, combat flight hours and Air Tasking Or-

ders. The unit achieved a 100 percent ATO rating and mission tasking completion rating while accumulating 1,853 combat sorties totaling 7,626.2 combat flight hours.

The 188th also contributed to the war efforts in support of Operations Enduring Freedom and New Dawn by deploying more than 50 percent of its personnel to 13 worldwide contingency locations during this time frame. Furthermore, the 188th Civil Engineer Squadron deployed to Guatemala in support of Operation Beyond the Horizon constructing a new school for 100 students in partnership with the United States Army while bolstering strategic international ties.

The 188th CES stood up the Air National Guard’s first and only Rapid Engineering Deployable Heavy Operational Repair Squadron Engineer (RED HORSE) training center as well as an Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) site providing critical mission training to civil engineers and firefighters throughout the ANG.

The unparalleled community service and achievements of wing members resulted in 11 national-level awards for excellence, leadership, service, public affairs, family readiness and psychological health. These accomplishments were recognized by senior-level officials including the Chief of Staff of the Air Force, Gen. Mark A. Welsh III, and the Chief of the National Guard Bureau, Gen. Frank J. Grass.

“This recognition of the hard work and dedication our Airmen have provided and continue to provide today is well deserved and illustrates the value of our 188th members to the nation,” said Col. Bobbi Doorenbos, 188th Wing commander. “Their accomplishments showcase the diverse capabilities of our wing and our proven contributions to national objectives. I couldn’t be more proud to lead these outstanding Airmen each and every day.”

The Air Force Outstanding Unit Award is awarded to units which have outstanding achievement that clearly sets the unit above national or international significance, combat operations against an armed enemy of the United States or military operations involving conflict with or exposure to hostile actions by an opposing foreign force.


## The 188th Wing hosts Native American Heritage observance

# Four 188th intelligence units receive Meritorious Unit Award

Air Combat Command announced that four units assigned to the 188th Wing, which included the 188th Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Group, 123rd Intelligence Squadron, 188th Intelligence Support Squadron and the 288th Operations Support Squadron, were among those honored with the prestigious Meritorious Unit Award for 2015.

The awarded units work with the 480th ISR Wing but are based at and serve under the 188th Wing. The 480th is the Air Force's lead wing for Distributed Common Ground Station operations around the globe and is headquartered at Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Virginia. The effective dates of the award incorporate June 1, 2014, through May 30, 2015.

The Air Force MUA is given to active duty, Reserve and Guard units for exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding achievement or service in direct support of combat operations since Sept. 11, 2001. The unit must display such outstanding devotion and superior performance of exceptionally difficult tasks as to set it

apart and above other units with similar missions.

Three of the four awarded units have been in existence at the 188th Wing for less than two years since the mission conversion from manned

operations, a space-focused targeting squadron and maintaining the Arkansas Distributed Ground Station, one of several nodes which are part of the Distributed Common Ground System, also referred to as the AN/GSQ-272 "SENTINEL" weapon system, and conducting near real-time exploitation of imagery intelligence data to provide actionable, multisource combat intelligence to combatant commanders and war fighting forces across the spectrum of conflict.

"Since the inception of the new mission at the 188th Wing, we have been working toward our goal of creating a world-class, one-of-a-kind center for ISR and RPA operations and we continue to make monumental strides toward that objective with accomplishments like this," said Col. Bobbi Doorenbos, 188th Wing

commander. "The designation of this award to these four units is not only significant because of the timeframe in which they have been operating, but truly showcases the depth and breadth of expertise and experience our Airmen possess at this Wing. I'm very proud of their accomplishment and know they will continue to achieve excellence in support of ISR operations here and around the globe."

# Price computes the quarterly recognition

Senior Airman Tyler Price heard his name Sept. 30 when declared the Arkansas Air National Guard's 188th Wing Outstanding Airman of the Quarter.

Price walked up to receive the award from the wing commander as a crowd of Airmen cheered.

The information technology specialist and cyber systems operator served with the communications flight for more than three years but first attended the University of Arkansas. He chose a career with computers with a business degree.

"I had a good affinity for computers when I started working for the City of Greenwood because my mother was a computer tech her entire life," said Price.

The City of Greenwood hired Price to map their water field using the geographic information system. They did not have a full-time IT, but they soon hired

Price as network administrator.

"Over the course of a year-and-a-half I got put into that role because of the problems I addressed," said Price.

Price said that he looked up to his great-uncle, an Air National Guard aircraft mechanic.

"I always thought what he did, even from a young age, was really neat," said Price.

He applied for a full-time IT position with the 188th Communications Flight and got the job.

He said that he overcame challenges in the Air Force networks, internet and email systems. He and his team developed a systematic guide to assist Airmen during a major network change.

"It was a massive undertaking, but having other people to rely on and to carry through is a good support system to have," said Price.

Price also provides customer service and support when someone on base has an issue, which

includes troubleshooting.

"To be good at this job, you need to have a very logical mind and be analytical in your thinking," said Price.

He said that a lack of these career traits makes it difficult.

"Tyler's work ethic is a breath

of fresh air," said Senior Master Sgt. Joel McDonald, 188th Communication Flight manager. "He's always looking to gain more knowledge and take on new assignments without question and do the research that it takes to make something work."
